

2022 Six Generations White Wine

WINEMAKER'S NOTES

This Six Generations White is a little different from previous vintages. In the past we have highlighted Albarino, however Albarino and Pedernales have officially broken up. Is there hope for reconciliation at some point? Maybe, but it's unlikely. The truth is we have had a hard time sourcing the type of quality Albarino we would hope for. It's also a grape that is low yielding and thus in high competition.

To mend our broken hearts, enter Muscat Blanc. A reliable, fruity, and easy going white wine that hasn't seen a bad vintage since we've been sourcing it. Muscat Blanc is here for us and we love that the nose smells like a spring or summer day in a field of fresh flowers. This wine is technically dry with 10 g/L of residual sugar which does nicely to balance the acid. We hope you'll enjoy this new iteration as much as we do.

TASTING NOTES

The nose has a lovely bouquet of tangerine, pineapple, and hints of brioche from lees stirring in tank. The body is light, fresh and crisp with a smooth mouthfeel and long finish.

Enjoy this wine now through 2026.

WELIKE IT WITH

This would be an excellent wine with fish or sushi, oysters, and even Thai food.
