

2019 Six Generations Albariño

WINEMAKER'S NOTES

Albariño is a white wine varietal popular both in Spain and Portugal. It is distinctly different from the other whites in our program and has been a fun grape to play around with in the cellar. In 2019 we harvested Albariño slightly earlier than in previous years to create a wine that is lighter and fresher. This vintage also received a fair bit of lees stirring which can help preserve fruit flavors and add hints of toast.

TASTING NOTES

The 2019 Six Generations Albariño is rich with notes of melon, honey, caramellized lemon and has hints of clove and dried pineapple. On the palate, you'll find this a lighter body wine but rich with juicy fruit flavors of apple, pear, honeydew melon and cantaloupe.

Enjoy this wine now through 2022.

WELIKE IT WITH

This Albariño works will with spring dishes and salads and would be a great picnic wine. Think chicken salad sandwiches, fresh fruit, dips and cheeses.
